## Seated Liberty Design in US Coinage By Rex Borders

Pocket Change

The Seated Liberty design, used in US coinage between 1836 and 1891, has the distinction of appearing on the most denominations. And because of the many years of issue on multiple denominations, the Seated Liberty has the most individual coins of any design series. This article reviews how the design came about and the history of its production.

US dollar coinage was first authorized by the Coinage Act of 1792. The first dollar coins were of the "Flowing Hair" design (1794-1795). These were followed by the "Draped Bust/Small Eagle" (1795-1798) and then the "Draped Bust/ Heraldic Eagle." The Draped Bust/Heraldic Eagle saw regular issue between 1798 and 1803. Several dollars were minted in 1804 but were dated 1803. The famous 1804 issue was made from original dies but not struck until 1834.



Most dollar coins were exported to make foreign payments. The silver content made them slightly heavier than the Mexican 8 Reales and they were readily acceptable to foreign nations. Also, the fluctuating silver price made them profitable to melt. For these reasons Thomas Jefferson ordered a suspension of the production of dollar coins in 1803.



Dollar production was again authorized in 1831, however, no action was taken until Robert Maskell Patterson became the 6th Director of the US Mint. He was tasked with developing a new design for the dollar. Being a fan of the English Britannia (1667 example shown at left, 1825 penny shown below), Patterson had the mint's chief engraver (William Kneass) develop sketches based on his direction. Patterson also commissioned contemporary artists (Thomas Sully and Titian Peale) to develop motifs similar to the English Britannia. Both these men produced similar artwork. Britannia herself dates from ancient designs.

Kneass had a stroke in 1835 before any coins were made. His assistant, Christian Gobrecht, completed the work based on sketches and artwork. Gobrecht created the first die and produced what is now called the "Seated Liberty" design. The first Seated Liberty dollar was minted in 1836 (photo next page). These first dollars are also called "Gobrecht" dollars because his name appears in the rock base. The similarities with Britannia are obvious. (continued page 2)

(continued from page 1) The US Mint used the Seated Liberty design on five denominations, half-dime, dime, twenty-cent piece, half-dollar and dollar. Each denomination had different dates of issue, but the basic design was used continuously for 55 years through 1891.

Various changes were made to the original seated liberty design over the years resulting in 5 or 6 types each depending on the denomination.

To collect every coin in the series is a Herculean task. A complete basic set of the series includes 472 coins. Throw in the major varieties and there are 508 coins, and with all varieties there are 642 coins (numbers include trade dollars, also considered

a seated liberty design.) For comparison a Barber basic series used on 3 denominations consists of 221 coins. Early silver

commemoratives consist of 144 coins.

Still out of reach for most collectors, a more reasonable way to collect these would be one example of each denomination and type. This would include 29 coins. One of each denomination is obviously 5 coins.

Many collectors want to add an example or two to their own collections. Maybe you're one of them.



First, the basics: for January we had an ending balance of \$30,533.38 plus 2 CDs amounting to \$20,280.02 for a grand total of \$50,813.40. There was a modest income of \$1,673 and expenses of \$4,472.18 plus a \$2.07 service fee. The largest expense was \$1,549.16 for new website startup. We also had several hundred dollars in total printing costs. In transitioning from a printed newsletter to an online version it should help somewhat to bring down printing costs.

Next, we are making gradual progress on moving our savings over to a Vanguard account which will pay much higher interest rates. There are various preliminary items which need to be taken care of before that is finalized, but it's coming soon.
