Taking the National Money Show by Storm

The ANA held its National Money Show (NMS) at the beautiful Broadmoor resort in Colorado Springs. The show brought together 138 dealers and thousands of collectors to celebrate all things numismatic. Despite 18 inches of snow, 3,624 collectors and lookers came for the great experience. What sets the NMS apart from the other big shows? – all of the





other things that ANA shows offer.

The variety of numismatic offerings was amazing. There were US coins, foreign coins, US & foreign paper money, bullion, ancients, collector items, and collecting supplies. I think everybody ended up taking something new home.

In addition to the fabulous selection of coins and currency, there were 13 free lectures covering a wide range of topics. The ANA Money Museum brought great rarities to display including a 1933 gold eagle, the first US dimes, the first large cents, a 1943 bronze cent and a 1944 steel cent. Dozens of competitive displays dazzled viewers in the hunt for ribbons. There were games and a treasure hunt for the kids, and meetings for clubs and committees. The US Mint, along with Mint Director Gibson, displayed and sold all of the latest Mint offerings.





The Albuquerque Coin Club once again had a strong presence at the NMS (at 400 miles from Albuquerque it was literally in our backyard). March Presentation

Ways To Collect

Our March meeting saw Rex Borders talking to the membership about ways to collect. Rex explored this very fundamental question and provided a range of options for people to think about. Before the options, he explored an even more basic question: why do people collect? There is no simple answer, but for the most part people collect because they enjoy it – the coins, the opportunity to make a few bucks, and the opportunity to put together a complete set of something.

There are several types of collections people can put together. The first is a random collection, or collecting whatever you like; many people have no rhyme or reason to what they accumulate. The second is collecting by theme; perhaps collecting things



with a common theme. Another method is to collect by a series – each coin of a specific issue. Lastly, collections can be by type, one of each design, one of each design or metal or time period.

Rex highlighted collecting by series involving date sets, basic sets (one of every date and mintmark), major varieties, and all varieties. He also explored collecting by type considerations talking about historical interest, greater varieties, budget, and storage space.

Calculating Numismatist

I'm sure you've noticed this high energy club member at our meetings. Scott has done a presentation for us on two cent coins, helps us with our computer headaches, and is always ready to help with a broad knowledge of numismatics. It is my pleasure to introduce him to you today.

Scott was born and raised in Cincinnati, OH. He came to NM to attend the New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology (commonly known as NM Tech) in Socorro, NM. He fell in love with the Land of Enchantment and has stayed for the last twenty-eight years. Scott earned a BS and MS in Mathematics at NM Tech. Scott has found his knitch working with Super Computers for Sandia National Laboratories.

Like many of us, Scott started collecting common coinage as a boy: Lincoln cents, Buffalo nickels and proof sets. Also, like many of us, his collecting efforts took a



back seat to school, family and work. He restarted his numismatic zeal in earnest about ten years ago. "I just love the history and understanding what was happening in the world to make the decisions on specific coinage at the time." Scott states.

Scott mainly collects US circulation strike coinage and has a number of complete or near complete collections; I am impressed by his nearly complete US Type Set. He admits that he has some limitations of budget for some of the really rare coins.

Scott lives in Rio Rancho with his wife Alli (a high-risk OB nurse), his son, Carter, and their two Irish Wolfhounds - Harry and Janet. In his "spare" time he likes to work on his collections, read about them, walk the dogs and cheer for his son at swim meets. He also confesses that he enjoys writing code to support his hobby.

ANA Diploma Program



The ANA Diploma Program is the cornerstone of the association's educational offerings. Completing the program confers the title "Numismatic Scholar." The program consists of six course areas:

Introduction to Numismatics Grading US Coins Today Detecting Counterfeit & Altered Coins Modern Minting Process Errors and Varieties Grading Mint State Coins



Much of the course material was out of date and the

courses are being revamped. They will have better color photography and better graphics. Each course will be offered on-line and will be available as their revision is complete. The first course, Introduction to Numismatics, will be released on April 29th. There is a \$75 fee which includes registration and course fee.

records, Federal and State tax filings, and to establish our Vanguard accounts. Thank you very much Rick.



This will be my final report. All good things must come to an end, and the decision was made that I should retire from this job. I have accomplished my objectives. There is now \$25,000 in a Vanguard fund where it will be making more than \$1,300 in interest per year. Over the past year before I took office the CDs made a total of \$30 so this is a sobering improvement. There is also a \$10,000 CD which will be maturing within the next 2 months. After that, it could also be moved to the same Vanguard fund where it can increase the yearly interest by another \$500.

The tax filings, both the state and federal, are all caught up.
