Pre-Euro Currencies by John Saiz


This year is the 25th anniversary of the euro being used via E-commerce, Traveler checks and electronic banking. In 1999, the euro became the Official currency of 11 European countries. The euro coins and banknotes would not be distributed until 2002 & each country phased out their currencies and replaced them with the euro.


Lest we forget, the pre-euro currencies of these countries unveil a rich tapestry of economic and cultural narratives. An example is the Italian Lira, which is traced to ancient Rome and symbolized Italy's economic resilience and historical continuity. It was introduced in 1861 by the Kingdom of Italy which includes Florence, Milan, Naples & Turin. The kingdom was dissolved in 1946, and the Italian Republic started the same year. The Lira was used until 1 January 2002, when Euro banknotes and coins were put into circulation.





The Deutschmark was the official currency of West Germany and the Federal Republic of Germany from 1948 to 2002. It was first issued under Allied occupation in 1948 to replace the Reichsmark and served as the official currency of the Fed-







(*Pre-Euro continued*) The French Franc was the oldest currency in Europe. The name comes from Latin words meaning king of the Franks. Its origins date back to the 14th century &

was used from 1360 to 1641. After a century and a half Hiatus, the Franc would return as the official French

currency in 1795. After 2 centuries of prolonged

inflation, the Franc was reintroduced in 1960 & was used until 2002 when euro coins & banknotes were put into circulation.

Kenny Sammut Numismatic Face of the Future

Most of the guys I profile have been collecting for decades and contribute to make a difference. This month's profile is different because we introduce a young man who is making a difference in his early 20s! Kenny Sammut is taking the hobby by the horns and is making a difference for all of us.

Kenny was born in the Ukraine and was adopted by Ken and Tomi Sammut and brought to the US at a very young age. He grew up in Chadds Ford, Pennsylvania, a suburb of Philadelphia. He has earned a bachelor's degree in Business Marketing from the Stillman School of Business at Seaton Hall University.

In 2007, my father purchased some Presidential Dollars. He knew they would not be worth anything more than face value in the future, but he wanted to get me involved in a hobby that he enjoyed as a kid. "I read the Red Book from cover to cover and fell in



love with numismatics. Early on, I was more interested in the money-making side, however I soon grew to appreciate the coins for their designs and historical connections. That is what led me to world coins - there is no shortage of history and beautiful designs there." "I am currently a vintage world coin grader for Numismatic Guaranty Company. It is amazing how much knowledge one can gain from seeing so many coins. There are so many aspects to grading, let alone counterfeit detection, that every coin holds something unique."

Kenny first joined the ANA in 2012 at the Philadelphia World's Fair of Money. In 2019 he was recognized as the Young Numismatist of the Year, and received a Century Award for signing up 100 new members. In 2023 he was elected to the ANA Board of Governors. "I want to give back to the association that has helped propel numismatics forward for over a century. I bring my marketing background to the board and, with the help of the marketing committee and the ANA staff, we have made great progress including hiring a Community Manager (continued page 2)

August Presentation

FUGIO CENTS

Do you know what the first coin authorized by congress was? It wasn't the half cent, cent, half dime or dollar, but the Fugio Cent. Our August meeting saw Jim Derrick educating the membership on this interesting, short lived coin.

Congress authorized the minting of a National Copper Cent in April 1787. A contract was awarded to James Jarvis to produce 34+ million copper coins; only about 1 percent of the authorized coinage was actually delivered. In September of 1788 the US killed the contract.





The Fugio ("Time Flies") cent was based upon the continental currency designs created by Benjamin Franklin. The obverse shows a sun dial, a meridian sun, the words Fugio and Mind Your Business. The reverse shows 13 connected rings for the original states surrounding "We Are One." Estimates of coins made range from 400,000 to 500,000+.
