

October Presentation

US Philippine Coinage

Our October meeting saw Scott Bucholtz educating the membership on Philippine coinage during the territorial and commonwealth periods from 1903 to 1946. The Philippine islands were ceded to the United States as a result of the Spanish-American war in 1899. The Philippine coinage act of 1903 sought to alleviate a coin shortage on the islands and lead to the islands minting their own currency. The US initially minted Philippine coins with their denominations at US mints. From 1903 to 1936, the obverse had a liberty design and Philippine denomination. The reverse had a "Sovern"

shield, date and mintmark. In 1920, the US established a mint in Manila, Philippines. This facility produced Philippine coinage from then on.

In 1936 the Philippines became a Commonwealth, and through 1945 the reverse shield was changed to reflect the new status.
