

ACC Awards and Rewards Program

The Albuquerque Coin Club (ACC) Awards and Rewards Program is used to recognize club members for their volunteerism, participation and leadership in several categories for both adult and youth members. The awards recognize: outstanding club leadership, knowledge, and participation (Johnny Plath Numismatist of the Year Award); sustained dedication, volunteerism, teaching and participation for more than 10 years (Life Membership Award); providing outstanding educational seminars and teaching of the hobby (Educator of the Year Award); as well as several other awards discussed in this document. The ACC also rewards its members for volunteerism in club activities by providing them with Club Bucks for their participation which can be used to pay for auctions purchases, purchase supplies, and other club merchandize.

This document describes the specific criteria and information about the ACC Awards and Rewards Program. Please review these criteria to learn about the awards and rewards offered, how nominations for awards are initiated, how award selections are made, and how and when club bucks are given to our members. Listed below is a complete list of ACC Awards and Rewards. Each of these awards/rewards have a specific template that describes the award/reward parameters and attributes. In addition, the ACC maintains a historical enduring plaque for recognizing past and current Presidents, Life Membership Awardees, and annual winners of the Johnny Plath Numismatist of the Year Award. These Enduring Plaques are displayed at club activities such as meetings, Trade Shows, and the Annual Holiday Dinner. The Awards, Rewards and Enduring Plaques include the following:

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Johnny Plath, Jr. Numismatist of the Year Award

1. General: This Award honors the memory of Johnny Plath Jr. and his legacy of contributions in numismatic leadership, participation and dedication to the mission of the ACC. This Award recognizes a member who has provided outstanding leadership, participation in ACC club activities, achievement in the field of numismatics, and volunteerism in club activities.
2. Frequency of Award: Awarded annually in December.
3. Nominations: To nominate a member, complete and sign a one-page award nomination form/recommendation and submit to the Board of Directors no later than the last day of September each year. The form is available upon request from the Board of Directors or available online from the ACC website at: <https://www.albuquerquecoinclub.com>.
4. Award Elements: Award includes an individual plaque. Also, the awardee is recognized for each year on an Enduring Plaque that recognizes all annual award winners.
5. Criteria for Selection:
 - a. Be an active club member (adult or YN).
 - b. Demonstrated contributions to the success of the ACC for the award year, participation in monthly club activities including meetings, coin shows, and/or educational activities; and/or
 - c. Demonstrated contributions to the field of numismatics / numismatic research; and or by providing examples of outstanding leadership and/or volunteerism.
6. Exclusions: ACC Life Members, who are recognized continually for their contributions including leadership and volunteerism with the ACC.
7. Selection of Winner: Awardee will be chosen by the ACC Board of Directors at the October Meeting and announced to the membership at the November meeting.
8. Presentation of Award: The Award will be presented by the ACC President to the recipient at the Club's Annual Holiday Dinner in December.

Life Membership Award

1. General: This Award recognizes an outstanding member(s) of the ACC who distinguish themselves as a leader, educator, volunteer and who has participated in ACC activities for a minimum of ten (10) years or more. The award symbolizes these common attributes: Showing one's selfless, consistent, long-term dedication and loyalty to the club and its membership. Putting the club before self, they love to give of their time and energy in addition to sharing their passion for the hobby and their knowledge with others. They go beyond the normal call of duty and make the improbable happen with ease for everyone else. They are the embodiment of what is best in our club and hobby. They are here to serve.
2. Frequency of Award: Awarded at the discretion of the Board of Directors. No specific frequency is connected to the award. A maximum of two (2) Life Memberships may be awarded annually.
3. Nominations: To nominate a member, complete and sign a one-page award nomination form/recommendation and submit to the Board of Directors no later than the last day of September of the award year. The nomination should outline the nominee's accomplishments, sustaining commitment to the ACC including their participation and leadership in club activities over a period of ten (10) years or more. The form is available upon request from the Board of Directors or online from the ACC website at: <https://www.albuquerquecoinclub.com>.
4. Award Elements: Award includes an individual Life Membership Award Plaque and Certificate; inclusion on the ACC Life Member Enduring Plaque; an ACC Life Membership Badge, and ACC membership for Life.
5. Criteria for Selection:
 - a. Be an active club member for a minimum of 10 years.
 - b. Demonstrated contributions as a leader, educator, volunteer and participant in ACC activities including, but not limited to:
 - i. Current or prior participation as a Board of Director or club officer for one or more terms of office; and/or.
 - ii. Current or prior regular participation in monthly club activities including meetings, coin shows, educational activities, club breakfast, picnic, annual Holiday Dinner; and/or,
 - iii. Chair Subcommittees of the Board of Directors or meetings; and/or,
 - iv. Participation in special activities such as club parliamentarian, ANA representative, communications coordinator, monthly test coordinator, State Fair or Trade Fair coordinator, auction manager or auctioneer, etc.
6. Exclusions: Members with less than 10 years of cumulative ACC membership.
7. Selection of Winner: Nominees will be selected based on merit and careful consideration by the Board of Directors, and a three-fourths (3/4) majority vote by the Board. In accordance with the ACC Bylaws, Articles III.C, nominees for Life Membership require "at least a three-fourths (3/4) majority vote (by the membership) at any regular meeting".
8. Presentation of Award: The award will be presented by the ACC President at a general membership meeting or the Club's Annual Holiday Dinner.

President's Special Award

1. General: This Award shall be presented at the discretion of the sitting President. This award recognizes a member who has provided outstanding leadership, participation in ACC club activities, achievement in the field of numismatics, and volunteerism in club activities.
2. Frequency of Award: Awarded at the discretion of the President. No specific frequency will be connected to the award.
3. Nominations: To nominate a member, the President will make a recommendation to the Board of Directors either at a Board Meeting or through email correspondence to the sitting Board Members.
4. Award Elements: Award includes an individual certificate presented at the next General Membership meeting after award of the honor.
5. Criteria for Selection:
 - a. Be an active club member (adult or YN).
 - b. Demonstrated contributions to the success of the ACC for a specific period of time, participation in monthly club activities including meetings, coin shows, and/or educational activities; and/or
 - c. Demonstrated contributions to the field of numismatics / numismatic research; and or by providing examples of outstanding leadership and/or volunteerism.
6. Exclusions: None.
7. Selection of Winner: Awardee will be chosen by the President with due consideration of the nominee by the ACC Board of Directors.
8. Presentation of Award: Award includes an individual certificate presented at the next General Membership meeting or the Club's Annual Holiday Dinner after award of the honor.

State Fair Numismatic Awards Competition

1. General: The State Fair Awards Program, sponsored by the Albuquerque Coin Club (ACC), includes numismatic competition by way of displays in the areas of coin, currency, and exonomia (anything else related to numismatics). The ACC works closely with the State Fair to provide a numismatic competition that is non-biased, objective and inclusive of both numismatist and public residents of New Mexico.
2. Ribbon Awards: Numismatist and public residents of New Mexico may provide numismatic displays and compete for Ribbon Awards and Special Awards in several categories. The Ribbon Awards include 1st, 2nd, 3rd place ribbons for each of three (3) categories of competitive displays including Adult, Child and Professional. These competitive displays are judged and awarded ribbons by selected members of the ACC. A Best of Show Award is also chosen by the Judges from among the Ribbon Award winners.
3. Special Awards: Special State Fair Awards are named in honor of two posthumous ACC members for their outstanding individual contributions in the field of Numismatics and to the ACC. Mr. Steve Acre, was a Life Member (selected in 2018) of the ACC who served in an outstanding fashion for many years as ACC Manager of the Numismatics Competition at the State Fair. Steve is remembered for portraying the appearance and dress of "President Abraham Lincoln" who he so dearly loved at State Fair and ACC Coin Shows. Mr. Bernie Linhart was a Life Member (selected in 2013) of the ACC who was an outstanding educator, member and volunteer contributor of the ACC for many years. These named awards include:
 - (1) The Steve Acre People's Choice Award: This Award is presented to the winner of the best competitive or non-competitive display, which is chosen by the highest number of votes received by public visitors attending the fair; and,
 - (2) The "Bernie Linhart Memorial Award" is the awarded as the "Grand Prize" for the best overall numismatic display, as chosen by unanimous decision of the Judges.
4. Classes of Awards: There are eight (8) numismatic classes available to participate in, including:
 - (1) Ancient Medieval Coins – Pre-1600,
 - (2) Foreign Banknotes,
 - (3) Foreign Coins,
 - (4) Mixed Classes (No one class is 85% or more of exhibit),
 - (5) Other Numismatic Items (ex: Stocks, Checks, Dies),
 - (6) Tokens/Medals – All types and countries,
 - (7) U.S. Coins, and
 - (8) U.S. Bank Notes (includes Confederates, MPCs).

5. Participant Categories: There are three (3) categories of numismatist competitors that may compete for awards at the State Fair. These include:
 - (1) Section 475 – Youth (17 years old and under),
 - (2) Section 476 – Adult (18 years and older), and
 - (3) Section 477 – Professional (Shall have more than 5 years of experience in class of numismatics being displayed, and previous award of a ribbon in either 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place, for a display in any participant category).

6. Frequency of Award: The Ribbon Awards and Special Awards are presented once each year at State Fair Numismatic Competition.

7. Participation: Any New Mexico resident, numismatist, or member ACC may participate in the State Fair Numismatic Awards Competition. There are two ways to participate:
 - (1) An individual may compete by registering for one or more displays with the State Fair Staff. The registration is administered by the State Fair Staff on two (2) scheduled days prior to the start of the fair. Dates and times are available on the ACC website at <https://albuquerquecoinclub.com> or the State Fair website at <https://statefair.exponm.com>.
 - (2) The second way to participate is to enter a non-competitive display. Participants will also need to register with the State Fair Staff on the selected registration days prior to the start of the fair.
 - (3) A \$5.00 entry fee is required for each participant, competitive or non-competitive.
 - (4) Displays shall be installed on selected dates prior to the judging and the start of the State Fair. Displays generally remain in place until the end of the State Fair.

8. Special Rules of the State Fair:
 - (1) The Albuquerque Coin Club will select three judges.
 - (2) Judges may not enter competitive exhibits.
 - (3) Any exhibit that wins an award may not be entered into competition the following year, except if the exhibit is changed by a minimum of 50% by removing some items and adding different items.
 - (4) No prior ribbons may be displayed.
 - (5) Exhibits “For Display Only” will not receive ribbons. However, these displays are eligible for voting by the public for best display (Steve Acre People Choice Award).
 - (6) Exhibit must fit cases provided by the Albuquerque Coin Club which measures (21-1/2” X 33” X 2-1/2” deep).
 - (7) First come-space available: Thirty-Six (36) total cases (Limit of 6 cases per exhibitor with maximum of 3 cases per exhibit).

9. Criteria for Selection:
 - (1) Ribbon Judging Criteria (Maximum 100 Total Points Available):
 - i. **05 points - Title and Scope:** The Title should be obvious. If necessary, there should be an explanation of what the exhibitor intends to show.
 - ii. **20 points - Basic Numismatic Information:** The numismatic specifications of the exhibited items should be described to the extent needed by the exhibit’s scope to answer the questions of another

numismatist. Examples: mint and mintage, composition, dimensions, designer, engraver, variety identification.

- iii. **15 Points - Special Numismatic Information:** Enough additional numismatic information should be given to answer the questions of a general viewer. Examples: historic, biographic, geographic, economic, artistic and bibliographic information.
- iv. **10 Points - Creativity and Originality:** The exhibit should be novel and imaginative.
- v. **10 Points - Attractiveness:** The exhibit should be neat, well designed and eye-catching. The color scheme should be pleasing and effective. The title and text should be easy to read and not faded or dingy from repeated display use.
- vi. **10 Points - Balance:** The numismatic items, the information, and the related materials in the exhibit should be balanced and related to the exhibit's scope.
- vii. **10 Points - Completeness:** The exhibit should present all of the numismatic material necessary to support the title and the statement of scope. Allowances should be made for lack of material that is not generally available to collectors or for which there is insufficient exhibit space.
- viii. **10 Points - Degree of Difficulty:** The exhibit should show dedication to collecting, in that the numismatic material or related information was difficult to assemble or to present. Examples: multiple rare pieces, new research, a collection that took years to assemble.
- ix. **05 Points - Condition:** The numismatic material should be the best that that is reasonably available to the exhibitor, who may make a statement about availability for the benefit of viewers or judges.
- x. **05 Points - Rarity:** Rarity is judged by the number of like pieces believed to exist, not by the value of the individual pieces.

100 Total Points

(2) Judging for the Best of Show Award (Maximum 50 Total Points Available):

- i. **10 Points** - Does display give a striking or exceptional effect or is it merely routine in its overall appearance?
- ii. **10 Points** - Does the exhibit present information beyond what is known to the average collector of this type of material?
- iii. **05 Points** - To what extent has careful research been done, as evidenced by the numismatic information imparted to the viewer?
- iv. **05 Points** - Is the information being presented in a logical and easily understood manner?
- v. **05 Points** - Would a non-collector understand the exhibit?
- vi. **05 Points** - Would a reader be inspired to collect this or related material?
- vii. **05 Points** - Does exhibit show dedication to collecting, in that numismatic material or related information was difficult to assemble or present?
- viii. **05 Points** - Does exhibit provide unusual opportunity to view and appreciate material being displayed?

50 Total Points

10. Award Elements:

- (1) The ribbon awards given by the State Fair include 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place colored ribbons in each numismatic classification (1-8) and category (Adult, Youth, and Professional).
- (2) Only one (1) Best of Show Award is given among the Ribbon Award winners. It includes a large multiple colored ribbon suitable for this award.
- (3) The Steve Acre People's Choice Awards include 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place ribbons. The First-place ribbon includes a multiple-colored large ribbon suitable for this award.
- (4) Only one (1) grand prize "Bernie Linhart Memorial Award" is given for the most outstanding numismatic display regardless of class or value. It includes:
 - i. One-year free ACC membership
 - ii. \$35.00 dollars in ACC Club Bucks
 - iii. A multicolored large ribbon suitable for this award

11. Exclusions: The Judges are excluded from participating in the competition.

12. Selection of Winners:

- (1) The judges selected by the ACC will select winners as described above.
- (2) The scoring criteria for Ribbon Awards and Best of Show Ribbon Award will be used to select the winners.
- (3) The selection of the Steve Acre People Choice Award winner will be tabulated by the ACC from votes submitted by the viewing public. The display with the highest number of votes received is selected the winner.
- (4) The grand prize "Bernie Linhart Memorial Award" will be selected by unanimous vote of the Judges.

13. Presentation of Award: All Ribbon and Special Awards will be displayed at the State Fair. The winning participants shall be recognized by the ACC at an upcoming monthly club meeting.

Educator of the Year Award

1. General: Description: One of the primary missions of the Albuquerque Coin Club (ACC) is to promote numismatic education to the members and general public. The Educator of the Year Award is given to a deserving individual who promotes numismatic education through club and/or independent activities.
2. Frequency of the Award: The award is given annually (calendar year) but may be deferred due to unusual circumstances.
3. Nominations: Nominations for the Educator of the Year award may be made by any member of the ACC. To nominate a member, complete and sign a one-page award nomination form/recommendation to the Board of Directors no later than the last day of October each year. The form is available upon request from the Board of Directors or available online from the ACC website at: <https://www.albuquerquecoinclub.com>.
4. Award Elements: The award includes:
 - a. Announcement to the general membership at a meeting
 - b. Recognition in the club newsletter
 - c. An award certificate and pin or plaque
5. Criteria for Selection: Nominees must be members in good standing. The award is granted to the member who most embodies the ACC goal of numismatic education through activities including, but not limited to:
 - a. Presenting an educational lecture at a monthly membership meeting.
 - b. Writing outstanding articles for the club newsletter (Pocket Change).
 - c. Writing articles for national publications.
 - d. Speaking at the State Fair.
 - e. Speaking at School educational activities.
 - f. Demonstrating leadership in club sponsored education, such as the ANA diploma program.
6. Exclusions: The following persons are excluded from consideration:
 - a. ACC Officers and Board Members for the current year the award is being considered.
 - b. Youth Numismatists (YNs).
7. Selection of the Winner: Nominations will be reviewed by the board at its November meeting and awarded based on a simple majority vote.
8. Presentation of the Award: Announcement of the winner will be made at the November membership meeting by the President of the club. The award shall be presented by the President or designee at the Club's Annual Holiday Dinner or other time as agreed to by the board.

Annual Youth Numismatist Program Award

1. General: This Award recognizes a general member that has contributed majorly to the expansion of or greatly improved the execution of the Youth Numismatist (YN) mission statement.
2. Frequency of Award: Awarded at the end of the year, on the last general membership meeting of the year in November.
3. Nominations: To nominate a member, a board member must put forth the name of the member as a potential candidate for the award. Other names may be recommended and voted alongside the initial recommendation. Board members are eligible for nomination by other Board for this award to help encourage and emphasize the expansion of the YN program.
4. Award Elements: Award includes an individual certificate and/or plaque or pin.
5. Criteria for Selection:
 - a. Be an active club member (YN or Regular).
 - b. Demonstrate an outstanding ability to grow the membership of the YN program or has vastly improved the YN program upon the execution of the YN mission statement.
6. Exclusions:
 - a. Not a member of the ACC
 - b. A standing President of the ACC
7. Selection of Winner: Awardee will be chosen by a clear two-thirds majority vote by the Board of Directors. If a member of the Board of Directors is nominated, a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors (excluding the nominee) is required, with final approval of the nomination by the ACC President.
8. Presentation of Award: Award will be presented by the President of the club at the last general membership meeting of the year.

Youth Numismatist Rising Star Award

1. General: This Award recognizes a Youth Numismatist (YN) member that has shown a consistent and ardent enthusiasm for the hobby of numismatics, through participation in Albuquerque Coin Club (ACC) sponsored events and has improved their knowledge in study of Numismatics.
2. Frequency of Award: Awarded at the end of the year, at the last general membership meeting of the year in November.
3. Nominations: To nominate a member, a board member must put forth the name of the YN member as a potential candidate for the award. Other names may be recommended and voted alongside the initial recommendation.
4. Award Elements: Award includes an individual certificate and/or plaque or pin.
5. Criteria for Selection:
 - a. Be an active YN club member.
 - b. Demonstrated outstanding participation in ACC events held throughout the year, including but not limited to general membership meetings, coin shows, educational activities, YN activities and/or any other notable ACC events.
 - c. Demonstrated deep interest in the study of the field of numismatics.
6. Exclusions:
 - a. ACC adult members.
 - b. Not a member of the ACC.
 - c. Anyone 18 years or older.
7. Selection of Winner: Awardee will be chosen by a clear two-thirds majority vote done by the Board of Directors, in order for the candidate to receive the award.
8. Presentation of Award: The Award will be presented by the President of the club at the last general membership meeting of the year.

ACC Club Bucks Rewards Program

1. General Description: "Club Bucks" is a rewards program of the Albuquerque Coin Club (ACC) to recognize members for volunteering, participating, and assisting in ACC activities. These activities include, but are not limited to assisting in club meetings, working at club sponsored numismatic shows, promoting club activities locally and nationally, trade fairs, and other club activities.
2. Frequency of the Reward: Members are recognized monthly at ACC meetings for their previous participation in club activities.
3. Selection: Members are selected to receive Club Bucks based on their participation in club activities as outlined below:
 - a. Receive \$10 in club bucks for winning the monthly meeting door prize.
 - b. Receive \$1 in club bucks for correctly answering a Quiz question at the monthly meeting (shall not exceed \$1 Club Buck per member for quiz answers per meeting).
 - c. Receive \$5 in club bucks for bringing in a new dues paying member to a club event or meeting.
 - d. Receive \$5 in club bucks for working a two-hour shift at one of the ACC sponsored numismatic shows including the spring and fall coin shows, summer trade fair, and other club sponsored shows. A maximum of up to eight (8) shifts per individual may be authorized, as determined by the Board of Directors and availability of funds.
 - e. Receive \$1 in club bucks for wearing an official ACC shirt to meetings, shows and trade fairs.
 - f. Receive \$25 in club bucks for developing and presenting an ACC education presentation at a monthly meeting.
4. How to spend Club Bucks: Club Bucks may be spent like real money for any purchase with the ACC, except for paying annual dues. Below are examples on how to use Club Bucks:
 - a. Buy 50/50 raffle ticket(s) at a regular club meeting.
 - b. Pay for a winning auction bid at a regular club meeting.
 - c. Buy YN Supplies, Books, Shirt or other club merchandise.
 - d. Buy club medals or tokens.
 - e. Use Club Bucks for admittance to the annual picnic.
 - f. Pay for your year-end ACC Holiday Dinner.
 - g. Use them for admission to the Coin Shows.
 - h. Coin Dealers at ACC Shows shall accept Club Bucks for payment on any purchases. Dealers may redeem accumulated Club Bucks for cash with the ACC Treasurer.
 - i. They may be used for certain trips and/or special event fees (as announced).

5. Exclusions:
 - a. Non-members of the ACC shall not receive Club Bucks for volunteer work activities. This does not apply to dealers who accept club bucks for sale of items at shows and redeem club bucks with the ACC for reimbursement.
 - b. Club Bucks may not be used to pay annual club dues.
 - c. Board members shall not receive Club Bucks for winning answers during monthly quizzes.

6. Cancellation of Club Bucks: The ACC Board of Directors may vote to cancel all previous forms of Club Bucks shall it become necessary to do so. A three-fourths (3/4) majority vote of the ACC Board is needed for approval to cancel Club Bucks. This may be done to perform accounting, prevent theft or counterfeiting, or to consolidate several forms of Club Bucks into a different format. In all cases, members shall have an opportunity to redeem previous forms of Club Bucks for new ones within a reasonable time period.

7. Presentation of Club Bucks: Club Bucks rewards will be presented to member(s) by the President, Vice President, or ACC Activity Leader during monthly club meetings or other appropriate venues.

ACC Awards-Rewards Program Document is published by the ACC Board of Directors and reviewed/updated as needed.
