The Case for Coin Shows by Phil Vitale

I hear people say that the days of coin shows are numbered. Dealers are aging out. People are buying everything online. The availability and cost of show facilities are making it more difficult. The club people running the shows are getting too old for the rigors of the work involved. To some extent all these things are true; however, there are good reasons to continue having coin shows as part of our club's mainstays.



The Albuquerque Coin Club runs two large coin shows a year. Among other things, they fund the club's activities for the year. The shows provide us with benefits beyond the monetary income. Working together to do all of the tasks to be



done builds esprit de corps among our volunteers. The shows provide us with direct contact and educational opportunities with the public. Coin shows bring the numismatic community – club, dealers & public - together. Last, but not least, coin shows club members and the public the opportunity to see and buy a broad array of coins and currency.

Offsetting these benefits is the great effort required to plan and execute a successful show. As much as a year and a half ahead of the show, the contract effort with the hotel venue kicks off. Dealer contracts have to be ready more than six months prior to showtime. An advertising plan (flyers, radio, posters, postcards, etc.) is determined is determined and executed months ahead until the day of the show.

Volunteers have to be recruited and assigned for all of the show tasks. These are the big deal tasks, there are many other things that need to be done. The actual show is the climax of all these actions. *(continued page 2)*

BEP Oops

Our April meeting saw Rick Ewing educate the membership on the Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) errors on small sized notes. The BEP uses plate numbers during printing to track printed sheets and monitor their quality. Although the BEP is meticulous about engraving exactness over millions of sheets, there are still some errors that sneak through.

Rick highlighted engraving errors that have occurred over the years. These errors included plate numbers engraved in the wrong place, missing numbers from plate blocks, omitted



plate block numbers, and numbers with the wrong size. Rick has a collection of thousands of error notes and is an expert on their printing and design.
