I recently returned from Summer Seminar in Colorado Springs, CO. The course material was engaging and the instructors were real experts; I came away enriched. However, the people you meet


provide a wonderful source of expertise and comradery – this "dividend" is perhaps as valuable as the course you take.



Michael Shutterly Making A Difference

I am excited to introduce an outstanding member to the club today. Michael Shutterly is an award-winning author, speaker, and coin displayer.

Michael was born in Florida, but was raised in Maryland. He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Physiological Psychology from the University of Pennsylvania and a Juris Doctorate degree from Boston University School of Law. He pursued the legal profession as a trial lawyer and then a financial institution staff lawyer until he retired.

Michael collected coins as a kid into adulthood, but stopped in 1977 when his collection was stollen .He started collecting again in 1982 and has continued ever since. Michael collects Byzantine coinage, Roman Republican denarii and early Medieval coins from western Europe. He also has a number of "just for fun" collections that include US Cents, Roosevelt Dimes and denarii of the Severan Dynasty. His focus now is on research and writing articles more than collecting.

Should you venture to the National Money show or World's Fair of Money you will undoubtedly see Michael's outstanding displays which always win rib-



bons and accolades. He has written award winning articles for the *Numismatist* and the *Asylum*. His exhibits for the Maryland State Numismatic Association, the Pennsylvania Association of Numismatists and Virginia Numismatic Association have also garnered awards. Michael also does presentations for the ANA's "Numisma" talks and participates in discussion groups on Roman Coinage.

June Presentation

Pre Euro Currency

Our June meeting saw John Saiz educating the membership about the pre-Euro coinage and currency from European Union countries. The Euro was adopted by 11 European countries in 1999, with the actual coin and currency not appearing until 2002. In this presentation, John focused upon the coinage from France, Spain, Germany, Ireland and the Netherlands. The bottom line is that pre-Euro currency had a colorful and unique coinage history.

John described the history of the pre-Euro currency for each country. France had the oldest currency dating back to 1360 when the Franc was introduced. Spain's Peseta was introduced in 1868 but was preceded by the Reales for hun-




dreds of years. Germany's Mark was introduced in 1871after the country's unification; the Deutschmark was the West German currency in 1948 and was carried forward after West Germany and East Germany united. Ireland's Irish Pound (aka punt) was introduced in 1928. The Netherlands first issued Guilders in 1434.


I love being a Numismatist and being in a hobby where I can study, learn and participate with others to acquire coins and improve my collections. This past month I was able to acquire a coin that I thought was impossible to obtain. I am a Franklin Half Dollar Collector who is always looking for ways to acquire coins without breaking the bank.



As many know, the ACC sponsors a Coin Breakfast every Saturday with a few exceptions (Balloon Fiesta and holidays). About fifteen members regularly attend and we meet at Weck's Restaurant, 4500 Osuna Rd NE, Albuquerque, NM 87109, from about 8:15 AM to 9:30 AM. We bring coins, paper money, and nu-

mismatic articles to share with each other as we enjoy breakfast and tell delightful stories of collecting. It is a fun event, and I'd encourage any members interested to come join the fun with us.

In early June 2025, a Member-Dealer joined the meeting and shared coins he was interested in selling. He brought over a Franklin Half Dollar to show me. It was a rare **1961 PF 67**



visible to the naked eye particularly in "E. Pluribus Unum," "Half Dollar," and "United

States of America." I hesitated, as I did not feel I could afford this coin. The total Proof Mintage for the 1961 Franklin Half Dollar was 3,028,244 coins. It is one of only twenty-seven (27) certified by PCGS and only four (4) are graded higher. I called the Dealer a couple of days later to decline his offer. I lamented because another excellent opportunity just slipped through my hands.





A couple of weeks later, the same Dealer attended the weekly breakfast again and I asked, is the DDR still available? He said yes and was open to trading for both coins and cash for the coin. Later that week I was able to obtain the coin and could not have been happier (pictured). It is an absolute rarity. Its PCGS price guide value is \$5,750.00 and this coin sold at auction in May 2017 for about the same price. Rick Tomaska, Author of "A Guidebook of Franklin and Kennedy Half Dollars," states "This is the king of twentieth-century Proof half dollar error varieties." In his fourth edition book, he estimates the Proof 67 value between \$6,000 - \$10,000 dollars for a brilliant Proof. A single Cameo Proof sold for over \$20,000.

Rex's Record

Club Bucks - Club bucks are an essential part of making the ACC operate. These are

monies created by the club and paid to the membership for acts of service to the club such as volunteering at shows. We paid out over \$700 in club bucks to volunteers at the Spring Coin Show. We pay our monthly educational presenter \$25 as an honorarium as a thank you for their efforts. Club bucks can be used to pay for numismatic items at coin shows and monthly meetings. Club bucks can also be used to pay for certain club activities like the picnic and holiday dinner. Many people do not spend the club bucks they receive, Result: we've **run out of club**

bucks. In 2023 we made a commercial purchase from the Highland Mint in Florida for \$5 and \$10 club bucks. The membership approved the BOD to spend up to

\$2500 on new club bucks but the board found some more cost-effective ideas. The board debated options and looked at cost, value for our money and turn around time. The Board ended up authorizing a three-prong approach. We will develop about 250 each of the \$5 and \$10 club bucks, including:

- 3: Pewter struck by Pressing Matters' LLC using dies from Highland mint.
